Fundamentals of European Union Law

The study of the discipline **"Fundamentals of European Union Law"** belongs to the cycle of professional and practical disciplines.

The subject of study of the discipline is the legal nature of the European Union, social relations, formed on the basis of its supranational legal system and its impact on interstate relations.

The purpose of teaching the discipline "Fundamentals of European Union Law" is the formation of students' scientific and practical understanding of EU law and its nature; awareness of the political and legal significance of Ukraine's European integration course.

The task of the discipline is the formation of the following learning studies:

- 1) knowledge about:
- the nature and preconditions for the creation of the European Union;
- basics of legal regulation of EU goods and services markets, EU labor market, etc.
- the system of EU law and its structure
- 2) ability to:
- qualify the spheres of legal relations regulated by the EU law;
- interpret and apply the norms of national legislation, taking into account the provisions of EU law;
- analyze the main provisions of the Association Agreement between Ukraine and the EU, understand the ways of further cooperation.

As a result of mastering the discipline students will be able to:

- to be guided in the organizational mechanism of the EU (structure, functions and powers of bodies, institutes and institutions of the European Union);
 - use knowledge of the main branches and sub-branches of EU law and its principles;
- understand the procedure for resolving disputes and exercising judicial jurisdiction in the EU:
 - to form a legal position on the legal status of a person and a citizen under EU law.

Course content: Legal system of the European Union; the formation of the European Communities and the formation of the European Union; the concept and structure of European law; sources of European law; areas of European law; institutions and bodies of the European Union; human rights protection mechanism in the EU; Schengen law; Association Agreement between Ukraine and the EU 2014; foreign and security policy of the European Union; legal regime of the Common Market; European National Bank; integration processes of Ukraine and the EU.
